Operation Calm Waters

As you are aware, visitor numbers at beauty spots and coastal areas increased significantly in 2020 and are expected to increase further in 2021. As a result, we have been working closely with other communities such as Lunan Bay, Arisaig and Loch Lomond and the Trossachs to learn from each other and plan for the year ahead. We are also working closely with Angus Council and national organisations such as Keep Scotland Beautiful, Zero Waste Scotland, VisitScotland and NatureScot. An 'Operation Calm Waters' plan has been developed in East Haven to mitigate against some of the problems experienced in 2020. As a result you may see some small changes happening across the village in the coming weeks and months which aim to encourage visitors to behave responsibly and comply with the Scottish Outdoor Access Code. The priority is maintaining safety and access to properties.

Following three serious accidents in 15 months on the C61 approach road to East Haven, the speed limit has now been reduced to 20mph.

Angus Council will also ensure that people do not park on the approach roads into East Haven or block access to Tankerville or Station Row.

Angus Council are considering what action can be taken to ensure that the bus is able to access the village square during busy times.

Some signs will be removed in the beach car park and new ones installed. New sign - LongRow

The pot holes in the village square will be repaired in early April

Yellow lines (or yellow cones as a short term enforcement measure) will be installed to prevent cars from blocking access under the railway bridge which happened again on 3 Jan 21. Also at the bus stop.

Can you help?	What's Involved
Gardening - main community gardens and head of coastal path	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do a little bit every now and again at a time which suits you. • Meet on a Thursday morning for one to two hours 10am - 12md. Bring a drink, hot or cold depending on the weather • Spur of the moment - link up with others by email or Whats App and go out for an hour when the weather is good.
Grass Mowing Rota	Can you help cut the grass in the main community gardens four times over the season. Honda self-propelled petrol mower and an electric mower available on site.
Help with boat repairs 'The Sisters'	This requires a degree of joinery expertise. Probably 3 - 4 hours over a couple of days
Help install new posts behind the roses and climbers in the main community garden	Will need a couple of people to work at a time as these posts are quite large.
Help with various small repairs over the season	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cement dog share station post at Heritage point • Repair at Eric's Bridge • Reduce size of metal signage posts
Help with painting jobs when temperature consistently higher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heritage Point • Blue Bridge • Railings in Car Park • Stain Fences • Stain Bothy shed and Resilience Shed
Join the rota of volunteers to help clean the public toilets	A daily expenses payment is made to volunteers
Become a Named driver for the All-Terrain-Vehicle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Help out with the Great Angus Beach Clean • Help emergency services attend incidents along the coast between Carnoustie and Arbroath
Ground works	Levelling and slabbing to the rear of the Bothy
Beach Cleaning	Either on your own or as part of the Great Angus Beach Clean
